ANNUAL REPORT 2023-2024

(for the year ended 31.03.2024)

The members of the Board of Management of ANEW have great pleasure in presenting their 27th Annual Report for the year 2023-2024 together with the Audited Statement of Accounts for the year ended 31st March 2024 and the Report of the Auditors thereon.

ANEW is committed to the cause of upliftment of underprivileged women by providing free-of-cost non-traditional skills training and placement. Since inception, we have trained over 15,000 candidates and currently target to train around 1500 candidates per year. Across all our courses, we have been successful in achieving over 70 TO 75% placement, consistently over the years. Currently, we have 2 Centres in Chennai – at Annanagar & Thoraipakkam.

The training courses include:

- Home Nursing (co-certified by Sundaram Medical Foundation, CURI Hospital)
- Basic Computer Applications (co-certified by NIIT Foundation)
- Advanced courses like TALLY & Accounting, Python (both cocertified by NIIT Foundation) and e-Publishing
- Car/Autorickshaw Driving (partnered with authorized driving schools)

We are pleased to share news of the past year's accomplishments in this Annual Report. Founded in 1997, ANEW has a long tradition of excellence in the empowerment of women. The Annual Report captures the dynamic quality that permeates every course and project, on and off campus.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR

Formation of the Board of Management:

A resolution was passed at the AGM held on 10th September 2023 to change the management structure of ANEW. A Board of Management was formed with seven members who previously formed the Management Committee, to govern the



affairs of the Society and a CEO was appointed to run the day-to-day affairs of the Society and to discharge any functions assigned by the Board.

The first meeting of the newly formed Board of Management was held on $04^{\rm th}$ October 2023 where Dr. M. Annalakshmi was elected to be the Chairperson of the Board.

Inauguration of New Centre at Thoraipakkam:

An important highlight during the year was the inauguration of a satellite centre at Thoraipakkam. Despite consistent advice to expand, the ANEW Board of Management remained cautious. However, based on the suggestion by Mr. Subbaiyan, who was a part of ANEW for 2 decades, to open a satellite centre in the OMR area of Chennai, and the recruitment of Ms. Bhuvana Murali as the CEO of ANEW, the Board decided to go ahead with this. By end-October 2023, the infrastructure & enrolments for Basic Computers and Home Nursing were in place and the centre was inaugurated on 1st November 2023 and an MOU was signed with CURI Hospital as the certifying partner for the Home Nursing course.

During the period from November 2023 to March 2024, 30 beneficiaries in Home Nursing & 74 beneficiaries in Basic Computers were enrolled at the Thoraipakkam centre. This success was made possible by individual donors and corporates along with the dedication of the Board and the ANEW staff members.

Computer Courses (Basic & Advanced):

The Basic Computer and Advanced Computer-based courses continued to be executed effectively, as per our scheduled plan.

During the year, we completed 19 batches of Basic Computers with an average of 25 students in each batch. In the Advanced courses, 6 batches of Tally Course were completed during the year, also with an average of 25 students in each batch, one batch of e-Publishing course with 12 students, two batches of Python course with 36 students & one batch in Web Designing with 9 students.



The students were also given additional Career Readiness sessions by SRM College students, Chennai Volunteers, M/s Korcometenz Inc., Ms. Bhavana Sharma of Rotary Club of Guindy, virtual Mock interviews & training by volunteers from Accenture.

Home Nursing Course:

The Home Nursing livelihood program was once again successfully implemented, with five batches completing the course, each consisting of an average of 28 students. The program has achieved an impressive placement rate of over 75 percent, ensuring that a significant majority of students secured positions in both formal and informal sectors.

Our partner hospitals/institutions- Sundaram Medical Foundation, Soundarapandian Bone & Joint Hospital, Apollo First Med Hospital, Appasamy Hospital, Banyan, Rishi Alayam for geriatric care, Carousel pre-school of Asan Memorial School for toddler care and SCARF for the care of mentally ill/dementia patients, continue to accommodate our students for nursing practicals.

Apart from the nursing theory, practical sessions & life skills sessions, the Home Nursing students also benefitted from additional sessions such as Physiotherapy by Revive Physiotherapy Clinic, Domestic Violence by Soroptimist International, Chennai, Personality & Grooming and Palliative Care by Lakshmi Pain & Palliative Care, Dementia Care by SCARF, Kidney Awareness by Tanker Foundation, Cancer Awareness by Vasantham Memorial Cancer Institute, Health & Hygiene by German Hospital, Financial Literacy by Chennai Volunteers, Female Safety by a Police Inspector.

Driving:

The driving program took a massive leap this year, with the trained student numbers jumping from 57 in the previous year to 107 students during the year 2023-24. Most of these beneficiaries started driving their own autorickshaw or rented ones. Some were also employed with Rapido, a ride-hailing service provider.

Apart from sessions in life skills, spoken English, and Krav Maga (self-defense), the driving trainees also attended Yoga and Wellness sessions conducted by Soroptimist International, Chennai, to promote mental well-being and women empowerment.



Total number of beneficiaries:

During the year 2023-24, 1004 beneficiaries completed the training program at the Anna Nagar Centre and 16 beneficiaries at the Thoraipakkam centre.

New Initiatives - Student Focussed:

First Aid & CPR training for Home Nursing students by ALERT NGO sponsored by Rotary Club of Chennai ChatGPT & Canva sessions for IT batches sponsored by FICCI FLO.

Placement Overview:

We are proud to inform that we achieved the following placement percentages during the year 2023-24:

- Basic & Advanced Computer Programs 81%
- Home Nursing 80%
- Driving 72%

Staff Training:

The new staff at Anna Nagar and Thoraipakkam attended the Training of Trainer programs conducted by NIIT Foundation.

Three of the staff attended a seminar on the Impact of recent amendments and Supreme Court Rules on Charitable Trusts, NGOs and Educational Institutions conducted by MCCI.

Awards/Recognitions:

Some of our beneficiaries also received awards: i) Ms. Pavithra Sivakumar, our Computer course alumna received the Best Performer Award at RR Donnelley; ii) Ms. Nithya from Arunodhayan, our Home Nursing course alumna received the Chief Minister's Trophy at the State Level Sports Competition.

Celebrations:

i. 26th Anniversary Celebrations:

ANEW celebrated its 26th Annual Day with a gathering of the Board members and staff. The annual Alumni Awards were presented to carefully selected alumna



from the three different training programs - Home Nursing, Computers, and Driving.

ii. Women's Day Celebrations:

Women's Day was celebrated by the Board Members and staff with some fun and games and refreshments. The women staff members were given sarees and the male staff members shirts by the Board.

iii. Pongal Day Celebrations:

Pongal was celebrated in a grand manner. The staff and the students took part enthusiastically. Students exhibited their talents through numerous competitions held such as Rangoli, Poster Making, Presentation Competition, Dancing and Singing.
